Get a taste for local life in this extraordinary tour that combines mountainous landscapes, a traditional meal and a medieval town.

You'll start by winding your way up the serpentine roads of Trojica Hill, taking in the panoramic views of Boka Bay (also known as the Bay of Kotor). Look out for Goražda fortress, an attractive yet imposing structure built as a military base during the Austro-Hungarian Empire, sitting 452m above sea level.

When you reach the mountain village of Mirac, you'll be welcomed by the family Kašćelan at their estate. After a refreshing drink, they'll show you the authentic way of life for people in this area, giving you a guided tour of the farm and vineyard. You're sure to work up an

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appetite, making this the perfect time to sit down to a feast of traditional Montenegrin food that's all organic and produced on the estate.

Then it's onto Kotor Old Town, and a walking tour of this UNESCO-protected walled city. With its narrow streets, lively squares, cathedrals, monuments and palaces, it's clear why this medieval gem is one of the most popular places to visit in the region.





Markovic Winery



Discover the secrets behind a perfect glass of wine, with an enlightening tour of the Markovic family winery.

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Q Trani Cathedra



Indulge the senses of sight and taste with a tour that combines Apulia's medieval architecture with the authentic taste of the region at one of its olive oil mills.

Your trip starts with a visit to the magnificent Cathedral of Trani, built in the Romanesque style in honour of the city's patron saint, Saint Nicholas. Constructed with the local sandstone, its distinctive white colour contrasts dramatically with the blue of the Adriatic sea. Cameras at the ready!

Next stop will be the Giovecca, or Jewish Quarter, built entirely of white stone. Feast your eyes on the Scolanova and Scola Grande synagogues, built in the 13th century, converted to churches in the 16th century and then returned to the Jewish community in 2006.





Soak up the atmosphere as you wander round Trani's vibrant marina and admire the view over the Adriatic before hopping on a coach for the final destination on the tour.

At Trani's oil mill they harvest and mill olives from their orchards to produce the green gold that is the region's famous extra virgin olive oil. Wander around the oil mill and then sample the produce - the perfect end to your experience of Trani.

There were four major pottery styles in Ancient Greece, red figure and black figure, Corinthian and geometric.

The ancient Greeks used ceramic vessels in every aspect of their daily lives, for storage, carrying, mixing, serving, and drinking, and as cosmetic and perfume containers. Today pottery plays a big role in the souvenir industry.

This tour gives us a fascinating insight into this key aspect of Greek history.

Rhodes has long been known is known for its

tradition in pottery and ceramics.

Records show how clay bricks from Rhodes were used in the construction of the dome of the magnificent Hagia Sofia Byzantine church in Istanbul.

We head to the north side of the island enjoying the panoramic views of the sweeping Rhodian countryside.

At the Bonis Ceramic Factory we find out about the various techniques adopted in pottery making. After a demonstration from one of the craftsmen, you will be invited to enhance your pottery skills and gain a very good hands-on understanding of the various techniques in order to help you make your own ceramic item. It will be shipped back to you.

After your hard work you will have earned some refreshing ouzo and Greek meze at the factory showroom before we head back to Rhodes Town.

The coastal path gives us four very different landscapes and is relatively flat making it easy for the average hiker.

Part way through there's a stop for water, fruit and a short break.

There is no shade on the trek so everyone is asked to come fully prepared.

Our walk is around 6.5km and finishes in Sarakiniko where we will be able to swim in the cove and fully appreciate this unique location.

The north winds have shaped the greyish-white volcanic rock into amazing shape.

The dazzling white rocks forming large and small caves in the sea, reflect the sunlight by day and the moonlight at night, creating the impression of a lunar landscape.

The breathtaking tour is around five hours, with the trek taking three hours.



Distance: We will hike about 6,2km without stops and Sarakiniko visit.

Sun protection: All of this hike is under the sun. There is no shade nowhere along the way so proper sun protection (hat, sun glasses, sun screen) are essential. People who have issues with the sun apparently is not advisable to participate.

Clothing: We need light and light colored, comfortable clothing. Proper shoes are critical

Mobility and health condition: We need participants with very good mobility and physical condition which is required for this kind of activity.

Water: Each guest needs to carry with him water. The guide carries an "emergency" water bottle. Each guest is recommended to carry 1,5lt of water with him, due to physical activity and sun dehydration comes fast.

• Veep any pearls you find



Depart from port for a panoramic drive to The Bahrain National Museum. On your way, you will see bridges, aquamarine blue water, Gulf Hotel, Grand Mosque etc. Bahrain National Museum built in 1988, the \$34 million complex offers a comprehensive view of Bahrain through the ages. Arguably the most interesting of the exhibits in nine halls is a reconstructed ancient burial mound dating to around 2800 scathe mound was actually plucked from the desert and reassembled in the museum. This museum is a virtual treasure house of history. One of the halls is devoted to Pearl and Pearling lifestyle can see how divers use to go down in ancient times.

Since ancient times, Bahrain has been famous for pearl diving and for the finest natural pearls in the Gulf area and in the world. Divers would be let down on a weighted rope, remain submerged for about one minute, collecting an average of eight to twelve oysters, and would then be drawn up by the puller (a well-muscled man who would remain on deck). Pearl diving reached its climax during the 19th century, before its fall in the early 20th century following



the discovery of oil and the introduction of the cultured pearl from Japan. It has been documented that 35000 tons of oysters were harvested annually during the 19th century which produced 80-90 % of the natural pearls in the world.

However, the tradition lives on, and about once a year the dhows will set sail to the pearling banks in search of the 'jewels of the deep'.

Bahraini natural pearls are considered the finest in the world, and incredibly - if you find a pearl whilst diving, it's yours to keep; an excellent (and possibly valuable!) souvenir. At the end return back to port.

Ephesus ranks among the world's most beautiful classical cities.

St John and the Virgin Mary visited and here St Paul wrote one of his most celebrated epistles, the Letter to the Ephesians.

Beginning at the Magnesium Gate we walk gently and leisurely downhill through Ephesus' marble streets, passing historically-significant sites such as the gymnasium, Temple of Hadrian, Upper Agora and Roman Baths.

Opposite Hadrian's Temple, at the foot of the Bulbul Hill and the covered part of the archaeological site, protected from the heat and natural elements, lie the Houses of Koressus or Terrace Houses.

It was here that the wealthy families of Ancient Ephesus lived. These villas are excellently preserved, especially the interior decor. The oldest houses so far unearthed date from the 1st Century BC, were built on two storeys and even had hot and cold and a heating system, clay pipes under the floor.

Then we come to the breathtaking Celsus Library, built in 135 B.C. and lavishly decorated with facades, columns and sculptures. The library once housed 12,000 scrolls of papyrus manuscripts, making it one of the largest in the ancient world.

A short walk away is the spectacular Greek Theatre, able to seat 24,000.

From here St. Paul preached to the populace, imploring them to give up their worship of Artemis and embrace the Christian faith.

Only foundations and fragment of the magnificent Temple of Artemis remain at Ephesus but just being at the site of one of the Seven Wonders is something special.

Once in Mali Ston, it's just a short walk to the dock where you'll board a boat that will transport you across the pristine natural landscape of the protected ecosystem of Mali Ston Bay and its small islets to your destination—a local oyster and mussel farm.

Upon your arrival at the oyster farm, you will meet a guide and local oyster farmer who will share his extensive family knowledge (and maybe a few trade secrets) in farming shellfish. Throughout the tour, you will hear stories about the region, its ecosystem and the environmental benefits (and challenges) of oyster farming and sustainable food in general. The ecological benefits of oyster agriculture are many, including the growing process that uses almost no greenhouse gas emissions, water, feed, fertilizer, or food.

Following a fascinating tour of the oyster farm, you'll get to engage your palate with a tasting of fresh oysters and mussels, along with a glass of a local wine.

Revel in the stunning surroundings as you ride along a scenic Adriatic road from the port of Dubrovnik to the green valley of Konavle. Upon arriving in the village of Čilipi, a local cultural center, you'll visit the Konavle Heritage Museum where local curators will tell the story of the creation and social meaning behind the national costume and its connection to the region's Konavle embroidery artform.

Continue this fascinating tour with an exclusive behind-the-scenes visit to AR Atelier, where you will be joined by Antonia Ruskovic, an academic painter, culture preservationist and the founder of AR Atelier. Antonia has studied the production techniques of historic Konavle embroidery and is dedicated in ensuring that this local tradition is passed down and kept alive for future generations through her social work training young residents in the cultural techniques and meanings of the traditional costumes. While at the atelier. Antonia will demonstrate the skill involved in the specific type of embroidery used in the creation of local costumes and also describe how she farms and breeds the silkworms-which she acquires through her work with local NGOs-used to produce the special silk. "With silk we are born and with silk we die" was a common saying among Čilipi residents, and one Antonia is hoping to revive in spirit.



Following your time at AR Atelier, you'll head to the protected area of the River Ljuta to visit a local watermill owned by Antonia's cousin. Here you will get a look into the production of the wool tread and felt that is necessary to complete the traditional costumes. During your visit to the watermill, relax by the river in the shade of the bay leaf trees and enjoy a tasty snack produced by local home estates along with locally produced wine.

The trip begins as you meet your photography guide and get some camera tips and techniques before you head out and start photographing Kalarinja, the oldest port in Dubrovnik, and the Fortress of St Lawrence.

Your first destination is a ground-level view of the impressive walls and fortifications that enclose the Old City, followed by Onofrio's Fountain–locations that we'll come to thanks to your photography guide's local knowledge. Over lunch, the family will delve deeper into their ancestral tales, including their role in the Konavle rebellion, illustrated by historical documents that underscore their significant place in the region's history. This visit offers a profound connection to the authentic life and legacy of the Mujo family, leaving you feeling like a true member of their community.

Our adventure begins as we board a 4x4 vehicle and drive south from the main town of Rhodes. Along with your guide Thanasis Christodoulou, a published contributor to National Geographic Magazine in Greece, and a permanent citizen of Rhodes, you'll drive through local villages and on unchartered trails. Along the way, stop for brief walks around various points of interest on the island.

After passing the villages of Filerimos and Pastida, your first stop will be at a historical landmark that offers a spectacular panoramic view of Rhodes from high above. The journey continues an exciting off-road route, passing through Psinthos Village and arriving at Ranger Hut View, a spot where North and South Island conifers, oaks, thyme, capers, cyclamens, and many other wildflowers can be observed.

Thanasis will share his local experience about the vegetation and wildlife of the area. You'll also learn about how the climate and the island's location are vital regulators in the growth of various plants, as well as which animals have survived here over the years. explore the crystal blue waters and rich marine life, but also many interesting relics which are spread from the ruins of the island's medieval castle. With its diverse coastline that engulfs pristine beaches and challenging diving sites, it is the perfect destination for adventurers and travellers alike.

As you make your way back to Skala, enjoy snacks, fruits and refreshments aboard the vessel.

Once in Skala, a fish-based meal from the production of LAMAR fish farm (Blutopia's production) will be served at a local restaurant before heading back to port.

Then, follow your guide to a private seminar room, where you'll take part in a handson honey extraction simulation. Practice professional techniques like honeycomb scratching and use tools, such as manual extractors, to fill empty jars. When you finish, sample and savor local honey offerings, which feature complex varieties like pine, thyme and erica. Plus, try the famous Melekouni, a traditional sweet snack from Rhodes!

After the tasting, walk next door to an active apiary, where you'll wear a protective suit and examine an open hive with an experienced beekeeper. Surrounded by happy buzzing, you'll learn about important tools, such as frames, smokers, and scrapers, as well as gain a practical understanding of how bee colonies are organized.





As the trip ends, you'll drive back to the port with a new understanding of the humble honeybee, our planet's ecosystem and what you can do to protect it.

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Meet a National Geographic-trained guide and set off on a tour of the Panathenaic Stadium. a marble stadium that hosted ancient Greek athletes as well as those who competed in the 2004 Olympics. Originally built for sporting competitions and official events in the fourth century B.C., the stadium was nealected for millennia before being resurrected by a wealthy benefactor for the first modern Olympics in 1896. These games saw competitions of fencing, gymnastics, weightlifting, and more, with some 240 athletes from 12 countries competing. They also marked the world's first marathon, conceived by a Frenchman but based on the tale of an ancient Greek courier, who is said to have run across the plains of Marathon to Athens to announce the defeat of Persian invaders.

Continue to the new Athens Olympic Museum, where a state-of-the-art exhibition traces the history of the games from their birth in ancient Olympia to their revival in 1896, to their return to Greece in 2004. Through dynamic digital and interactive displays, as well as tangible artifacts from ancient to modern times, delve into the stories of celebrated athletes and the important role of sports and the Olympics in the evolution of Athens.

Your final stop is the Athens Olympics Complex, the city's main modern sports facility, which was given a thorough redesign by



famed Spanish architect Santiago Calatrava in preparation for the 2004 Summer Olympics. Here, by special arrangement, you'll meet with a former Olympic athlete for a tour of the site and a personal perspective on the games. As you walk along Calatrava's soaring Wall of Nations and into arenas and halls where the world's top gymnasts and sprinters competed, gain insight into the daily life of an Olympic athlete and what it is like to participate in the games. Take home your very own Olympic medal for participating in this experience as well as a commemorative photograph to remember it!
